Introduction

God's grace enables us to stand firm in the mist of persecution Peter's final words encourage the believers to serve faithfully with their hope in God's grace to enable them to serve with joy.

Apart from suffering from the end times, the believers still have to face their three great enemies, the world the flesh and the devil. Christian leaders are to be shepherd's not lords. The ancient Israelite shepherd would go before his sheep to lead them; he wouldn't put the sheep in front of him. God's shepherds must feed and protect those whom they have been given the responsibility of shepherding as God's flock.

Serving must be done with a willing and humble heart. By nature, we don't want to submit to others. If we are submitted to the Lord, we will be able with God's grace to submit to one another. Satan is always looking out for ways to devour, if he can't destroy with outward persecution, he will try to creep in through inward division. Their hope is to rely on the grace of God who will perfect, establish, strengthen and settle them as they keep their eyes on the goal of their eternal glory in Christ.

Treasures of the Heart

Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. 9 Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world. Peter 5:8-10

1 Peter 5:1-4

1 The elders who are among you I exhort, I who am a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that will be revealed: 2 Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly; 3 nor as being lords over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock; 4 and when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that does not fade away.

Digging Deeper

Getting The Point


