

New Covenant Sacrifice Hebrews 10:1-18 Lesson 12

Background Information

The sacrifices prescribed by the law prefigured Christ's ultimate sacrifice. They were repeated year after year, the very repetition bearing testimony that the perfect, sin removing sacrifice had not been offered yet.

The author has argued for the superiority of Christ as a Priest after the order of Melchizedek over the Levitical priests. The superiority of Christ's priestly ministry entailed a superior sacrifice. The law could never make the worshiper perfect. Christ our superior sacrifice **perfects** the New-Covenant worshiper.

The sanctuary was reserved for the service of the priests, but the most holy place could be entered by the high priest alone, and even he could enter only one day a year. But Jesus perfect sacrifice opened the way, so that His followers could join Him in the full presence of God. The prophetic Psalm 40 tells us, "Not sacrifices, but rather a body to do God's will" is the ultimate sacrifice.

LOOKING FOR GOLD - WHAT DOES IT SAY?



The first step in mining for gold is getting the lay of the land. Carefully observe the text looking to see where you might dig to find hidden treasure. Mark your text looking for repeated words, contrasts or similarities. Look for answers to, Who? What? When? Why or How?

Setting the scene: You may want to begin your reading with Lev 16: especially v. 34, Ps. 40, Ps.51:16-17, Jn. 1:14, Col. 2:11-17

Hebrews 10:1-4

1 For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, make those who approach perfect. 2 For then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins. 3 But in those *sacrifices* there is a reminder of sins every year. 4 For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins.

Hebrews 10:5-10

5 Therefore, when He came into the world, He said:
"Sacrifice and offering You did not desire,
But a body You have prepared for Me.
6 In burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin
You had no pleasure.
7 Then I said, 'Behold, I have come —
In the volume of the book it is written of Me —
To do Your will, O God.'"
8 Previously saying, "Sacrifice and offering, burnt offerings, and offerings for sin You did
not desire, nor had pleasure in them"(which are offered according to the law), 9 then
He said, "Behold, I have come to do Your will, O God." He takes away the first that He
may establish the second. 10 By that will we have been sanctified through the offering
of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

Hebrews 10:11-18

11 And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. 12 But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God, 13 from that time waiting till His enemies are made His footstool. 14 For by one offering He has perfected forever those who are being sanctified.

15 But the Holy Spirit also witnesses to us; for after He had said before,
16 "This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put My laws into their hearts, and in their minds I will write them," 17 then He adds, "Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more." 18 Now where there is remission of these, there is no longer an offering for sin.
